



UPDATE ON THE JOHNSTOWN INCLINED PLANE REHABILITATION PROJECT

For Immediate Release:

Johnstown, PA - (August 28, 2026) The Cambria County Transit Authority (CamTran) is providing an update on the ongoing inspection and approval process required to resume operations at the Johnstown Inclined Plane.

CamTran reported on August 10 that during an inspection conducted by the Pennsylvania Department of Labor & Industry (L&I) and the State Safety Oversight (SSO) Program, one of the passenger gate locks was found to be malfunctioning and not operating as designed. As a result, the Inclined Plane did not receive the required certification to reopen to the public. Since then, a new passenger gate locking mechanism has been installed and is functioning as intended.

Next Steps:

We have scheduled L&I and SSO representatives to inspect the passenger gate lock on **September 3, 2026**.

CamTran Executive Director Rose M. Lucey-Noll, stated, "We all want the Inclined Plane to reopen, with safety serving as our guiding principle from the outset."

Asiago's Tuscan Italian restaurant, located in the Inclined Plane's Visitor's Center, remains open throughout the duration of the project.
